

HOW TO GET A LIBRARY CARD

Bring a valid photo ID and proof of your current address. Children under 6th grade need a parent or guardian to co-sign.

Non-residents -WPL participates in Iowa's Open Access program. To get a WPL card, your hometown library must participate in Open Access.

A WPL library card is required to check out materials and to use the Internet.

CHECK OUT PERIODS

Express Books—1 week with **no renewal**

DVDs—3 days with two, 3-day renewals

Express DVDs—3 days with **no renewal**

Current magazines—do not circulate

Noncurrent magazines—1 week with **no renewal**

Video Games—1 week with **no renewal**

New Music CDs—1 week with **no renewal**

TV Series on DVD—1 week with with two, 1-week renewals

Books, AudioBooks, Playaways, Older Music CDs—3 weeks with two, 3-week renewals

For the first three months, new card holders are limited to 5 checked out items at a time. Existing card holders may check out up to 10 DVDs and up to 3 video games at a time. There is no limit on print materials.

RETURNING MATERIALS BEFORE/AFTER HOURS

Return chutes are located outside the front door of the library for books, magazines and A/V materials.

Fines for overdue materials are limited to \$5 per item. Fines for all materials are \$.25 per day, except Express Books and DVDs, which are \$.50 per day.

MEETING ROOMS

Meeting rooms are available for non-profit organizations and public use. Reservations can be made in the Circulation Department or by calling 319-291-4480.

eLENDING

The Waterloo Public Library is pleased to offer OverDrive, our lending service for eBooks and eaudiobooks. Other e-services include full color digital e-zines through Zinio and free music and video downloads via Freegal.

OverDrive also offers a digital collection just for children; be sure to check out animated, talking picture books from TumbleBook Library.

SAFE CHILD POLICY

The Waterloo Public Library welcomes children of all ages. However, children age 10 years and under must be accompanied by a parent or responsible caregiver at all times while in the library.

PUBLIC COMPUTERS

WPL offers Internet access on public computers on a first come, first served basis. A WPL library card and PIN is required. WiFi is also available. Black and white and color printing are available for a small charge.

Patrons whose accounts have gone into the collections phase (lost material charges in excess of \$25.00 or fines exceeding \$50.00) will be blocked from using the public computers.

INTERLIBRARY LOANS (ILL)

If WPL does not own the item you are looking for, we can attempt to borrow it from another library. You will need your library card and as much information as you can provide for books, magazine articles and microfilm. Up to three ILL requests allowed at any one time. Beginning July 1, 2017, patrons who borrow through ILL will be charged \$2.00 for each item received.

YOUR LIBRARY PIN

A four-digit numeric PIN in combination with your library card number allows you to:

- Check out
- Look up your record
- Renew or request material
- Reserve a public library computer
- Print in monochrome or color
- Download electronic resources

If you do not know your PIN, you can try:

For security purposes, your PIN should be kept private. A PIN may be changed in the My Account screen of the library catalog.

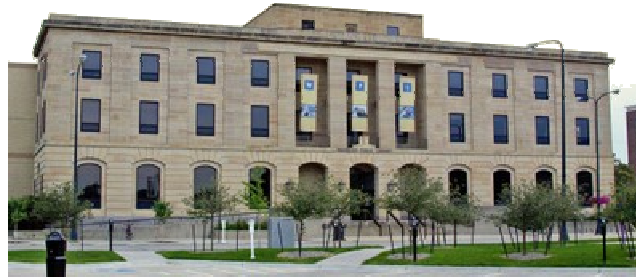
FRIENDS OF THE LIBRARY
